

### A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew

'Where is the infant king of the Jews?' they asked. 'We saw his star as it rose and have come to do him homage.' When King Herod heard this he was perturbed, and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and the scribes of the people, and enquired of them where the Christ was to be born. 'At

Bethlehem in Judaea,' they told him 'for this is in the land of Judah you are by no means least come a leader who will shepherd my people



had appeared, and sent them on to Bethlehem. 'Go and find out all about the child,' he said 'and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do him homage.' Having listened to throngs will cover you, and dromedaries of Midian and Ephah; what the king had to say, they set out.
