- 3. Recitation of the Creed
- 4. Praying the Lord's Prayer
- 5. Praying for the intentions of the Holy Father
- 6. Having a serious intention to avoid all attachment to sin.

Pilgrims are encouraged to discover other ways in which Indulgences may be gained during the Jubilee Year.
