Jubilee Year 2025

Charity is a principal characteristic of the Christian Life. No one can think that pilgrimage and the celebration of the indulgence of the Jubilee can be reduced to a magical ritual, without knowing that it is a life of charity that gives them ultimate meaning.

Furthermore, charity is the pre-eminent sign of the Christian faith and its specific form of credibility. In the context of the Jubilee, the apostle Peter's invitation cannot be

forgotten: "Above all, let our love for one another be intense, because love covers a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8). According to John the evangelist, love toward one's neighbour, which comes not from man but from God, will ensure that true disciples of Christ will be recognized in the future. It is apparent, therefore, that no believer can claim to believe if they do not then love, and conversely, they cannot say they love if they do not believe. Paul the

apostle also reiterates that faith and love make up the identity of the Christian: love is what begets perfection (see Col.3:14), faith what enables love to be such.

Charity, therefore, has its special place in the life of faith: moreover, in light of the Holy Year, Christian witness must be reaffirmed a more expressive form of conversion.

As we begin the season of Lent, we hear Luke's version of the three temptations of Jesus at the beginning of his public ministry. His responses will determine the direction of his mission.

The first temptation is about food. "Turn this stone into bread." After being without food for forty days it would have been simple for Jesus to satisfy his hunger by turning stone into bread by using his divine power. Jesus does not succumb to self-aratification but quotes the Book of Deuteronomy reminding the devil that we do not live "on bread alone."

Today, the temptation to selfindulgence is not simply about food,

but it may be about a lifestyle where our personal concerns are prioritised above the needs of others.

The second temptation is about power over others when the devil invites Jesus to exercise authority over nations. This is a seductive temptation for power and control is an aphrodisiac, and Pope Francis constantly warns us against the abuse of power when we use our roles in church and society to aggrandise ourselves rather than promote the concerns of evidenced in the ministry of Jesus.

The third temptation is for Jesus to do something him to stay away from Jerusalem and certain



amazing by throwing himself off the top of the temple and asking the angels to catch him. Jesus resists the temptation to do something spectacular and reproves the devil by auotina scripture to confirm God's love for those who are faithful. Success is not everything as Mother Theresa famously put it: "God has not called us to be successful but to be faithful."

This does not mean that our lives will be free from temptation, but scripture teaches us that Jesus overcame the devil and won the battle for

those less fortunate. Jesus calls us to promote us and for our world. In the wilderness and on not ourselves but commitment to the needy as the cross Jesus resisted the devil's temptations. He did not listen to Peter, who tried to convince

> death. He did not call on an army of angels when arrested in the garden of Gethsemane. Even crucified on the cross. Jesus refused to save himself.

> We do not have to fear the devil because Jesus has defeated him. Which means that no matter what is happening in our lives, no matter the temptations, trials and tests we might be aoina through, we can turn to Jesus. and he will be there for us, to lead and quide us along the way.

We will not be challenged as Jesus was, but we will be tempted to live for ourselves, to exercise power and control, and to focus on success rather than faithfulness. Jesus teaches us that through prayer, scripture, the guidance of the Holy Spirit, and service of others we will be able to resist temptation and be missionary disciples proclaiming the good news by word and deed.
