Diocese of Geraldton What is the Code of Conduct?

This Easy English format of the Diocese of Geraldton's Code of Conduct has been developed for our workers and volunteers.



Why I need to read this:

All people who serve the Church have a responsibility to behave in a way that follows the example of Christ. This means that in what we say and do, we should be:

- Kind and compassionate
- Honest and trustworthy
- Respectful of all people

What is a Code of Conduct?

To help us to know what is expected of us, the Church also has a Code of Conduct. The Code of Conduct sets out how we must behave and act towards one another.

You must follow the Code of Conduct if:

- You work or volunteer at the Church.
- You interact with children at the Church.
- You are a Church leader. For example, a parish priest or a Bishop.

This Code of Conduct for the Church community of the Diocese of Geraldton supports the ACSL National Catholic Safeguarding Standards.

The Code provides rules for what you **must do**.
For example:

You must respect people's rights

All members of the Church Community have the right to be:

- treated with respect
- safe
- listened to and heard
- treated fairly and the same as other people
- given help when it is needed
- treated with dignity

You must keep children safe. Children means anyone under 18 years of age.

A child is not safe if someone is hurting them.

Hurting a child includes:

- physical actions
- saying things to make a child feel bad
- inappropriate sexual actions with a child.

You must tell someone if you think this is happening.

You must protect the safety and wellbeing of vulnerable people. Vulnerable people include people who have a disability or are elderly.



The Code provides rules for what you **must not do**.
For example:

- You must not treat other people unkindly. It is not okay to shout, yell or hurt people.**
- You must not hurt children, punish children, or give dangerous things to children, like alcohol or drugs. You must not do rude things in front of children or to them.**
- You must not bully, harass or hurt vulnerable people. You must not do rude things in front of them or to them.**

What happens if I do not follow the Code of Conduct?

- If you do not follow the Code of Conduct, disciplinary action may be taken against you.
- Disciplinary action means that you may not be allowed to do certain things at the Church or for the Church community.
